### About the Program

Spend 8 days immersed in Jamaica, working with the community and touring cultural and natural area venues. Participants can choose from **four** learning experiences tailored to their field of study: (i) Environmental studies and eco-tourism in mountains, streams, and beaches/coral reefs; (ii) Education outreach in four area schools from Pre-K through high school; (iii) International culture and study abroad. The guest house provides a great view and is across from the Bluefields Bay Beach. Tours include mountain hikes, snorkeling on coral reefs, organic farms, and YS Falls. Cultural experiences include folk dancing and cooking lessons for Jamaican cuisine. The focus is on community service and sustainable community development.
